Citizenship and Social Development Mainland Study Tour Project Learning Report Award Scheme

Summary

This circular memorandum invites all secondary schools (including special schools) to participate in the Citizenship and Social Development Mainland Study Tour Project Learning Report Award Scheme (Award Scheme).

Background

- 2. Citizenship and Social Development (CS) was introduced at Secondary Four starting from the 2021/22 school year and is now fully implemented across senior secondary level. The CS curriculum comprises three themes, namely "Hong Kong under 'One Country, Two Systems", "Our Country since Reform and Opening-up" and "Interconnectedness and Interdependence of the Contemporary World". These themes aim to help students build a solid knowledge base and develop skills of critical thinking, rational analysis and problem-solving, as well as foster proper values and attitudes and a sense of national identity, through studying important topics relating to Hong Kong, our country and the contemporary world. CS Mainland study tours and the related project learning are integral parts of the curriculum. All senior secondary students taking local curriculum will be fully subsidised to participate in CS Mainland study tours organised by the Education Bureau (EDB) once, enabling them to gain first-hand understanding of the latest developments and achievements of our country, thereby building up cultural confidence and fostering a sense of national identity. Upon completion, students are required to submit the project report to the school individually, but it is not part of public assessment.
- 3. The EDB launched the CS Mainland study tours in the 2022/23 school year. To date, over 140, 000 senior secondary students and 15, 000 teachers have participated Teachers and students have positive feedback on CS Mainland study tours, widely recongising that the study

tours help extend classroom learning and achieves fruitful learning outcomes. The EDB attaches great importance to students' learning outcomes of the CS Mainland study tours and continually collects photographs, student reflections and videos related to the tours from schools, and showcase them through various channels, including the CS Mainland study tours dedicated webpage and teacher professional development programmes.

- 4. The Award Scheme aims to invite schools to nominate students' CS Mainland study tour project learning reports (project learning reports), to recognise and commend students who have diligently completed the project learning reports and demonstrated outstanding performance as well as their supervising teachers for further showcasing related learning outcomes, enhancing the effectiveness of learning and teaching of the CS curriculum and its related Mainland study tour project learning.
- 5. The project learning reports recommended by schools must be completed by students after participating in the CS Mainland study tours organised by the Education Bureau. For requirements of project learning reports, please refer to the *Curriculum and Assessment Guide for the Subject of Citizenship and Social Development (S4 to S6)*.

Details of Citizenship and Social Development Mainland Study Tour Project Learning Report Award Scheme

Target

- Students of senior secondary Citizenship and Social Development;
- Schools joining CS Mainland study tours in the 2024/25 and 2025/26 school years submit their recommended project learning reports on or before the specified period as follows:

School year	The specified period
Students participating in CS Mainland study tour in the 2024/25 school year	On or before 19 December 2025
Students participating in CS Mainland study tour in the 2025/26 school year (For tours completed between October 2025 and July 2026)	Within six weeks after the CS Mainland study tours

• Each school may recommend no more than 3 project learning reports, either from two school years or from one of the school years.

Awards and announcement of results

- The Award Scheme comprises the Special Commendation Awards and the Merit Awards.
 Adjudication criteria of the awards are outlined in Appendix III.
- Reports that meet the adjudication criteria will be considered for the Merit Award, while outstanding reports may be recognised with the Special Commendation Award.
- The results will be notified to the winning schools by email tentatively in September 2026, and they will be invited to attend the awards ceremony and learning outcomes sharing session.
- Relevant details of the above will be announced in due course.

Online briefing sessions

- The EDB will conduct two identical online briefing sessions on 24 and 26 November 2025 to introduce the details of the Award Scheme to schools.
- Teachers may enroll via the EDB Training Calendar System.

Displaying students' learning outcomes

• The EDB will adopt diversified modes to consolidate and display project learning reports, including uploading them onto the dedicated webpage of CS Mainland study tours (https://cs.edb.edcity.hk/tc/mst_sharing.php) or showing them in teacher professional development programmes. Schools should have obtained consent of the relevant parties (including students and their parents/ guardians) before submission of student work and authorise the EDB to use, edit or publish the content of student work, in whole or in part, for educational or publicity purposes. A consent form is available for downloading on the dedicated webpage of CS Mainland study tours (https://cs.edb.edcity.hk/file/public/mainland_study_tour/CS_MST_consent_form.docx).



Project Learning Report

- Must be in accordance with the related learning requirements mentioned in *Citizenship and Social Development Curriculum and Assessment Guide (Secondary 4 to Secondary 6)*;
- Must be submitted individually to the school by the student;
- May be presented in written mode **or** non-written mode;
- Must clearly list the sources of reference materials, such as authors, sources, book/article
 titles (if applicable), and URLs (if applicable). Photos taken on-site by students and leaflets
 or other materials obtained from the site(s) of the visit included in the report must be
 properly indicated;
- May focus on the overall itinerary of the study tours **or** individual visiting sites to show that the report is related to the study tour.
- Must briefly explain how the study tour helps enhance understanding of the learning content of the CS curriculum.

Adjudication Criteria

- Whether the project learning report demonstrates the student's learning before, during, and
 after the study tour, including self-directed learning capabilities, such as setting the research
 topic and scope, collecting data, and using study tour experience to make personal
 reflection;
- Whether the project learning report demonstrates the student's acquired knowledge, personal reflection, and proper values and attitudes;
- Whether the presentation of the report (including brief descriptions in non-written mode) clearly expresses the student's ideas.
